HEAD OF SCHOOL

Mr. Ed Hardin served his 5th year as head of school. Under his leadership, the vision for Classical Christian Education became more robust and desired. Mr. Hardin promoted the CCE mission and BCA became more firmly rooted in the CCE movement. As a result, BCA earned accreditation from the Classical Latin School Association. Although faced with maneuvering the trials of a pandemic, Mr. Hardin led the school financially in such a way that doubled the average monthly bank balance. Feed the Need was established as a school tradition and fundraiser that supports two great causes- feeding children (locally and abroad) and raising funds for Bluegrass Christian Academy. Under his leadership, The Champion Group provided an Assessment of BCA in order to bring to light SWOT and to guide strategic planning efforts by the board. Mr. Hardin began his resignation process with the board in December 2022. We are grateful for Mr. Hardin's lasting impact, leadership, labor, and love for our school.
